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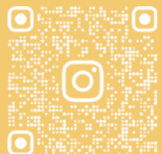

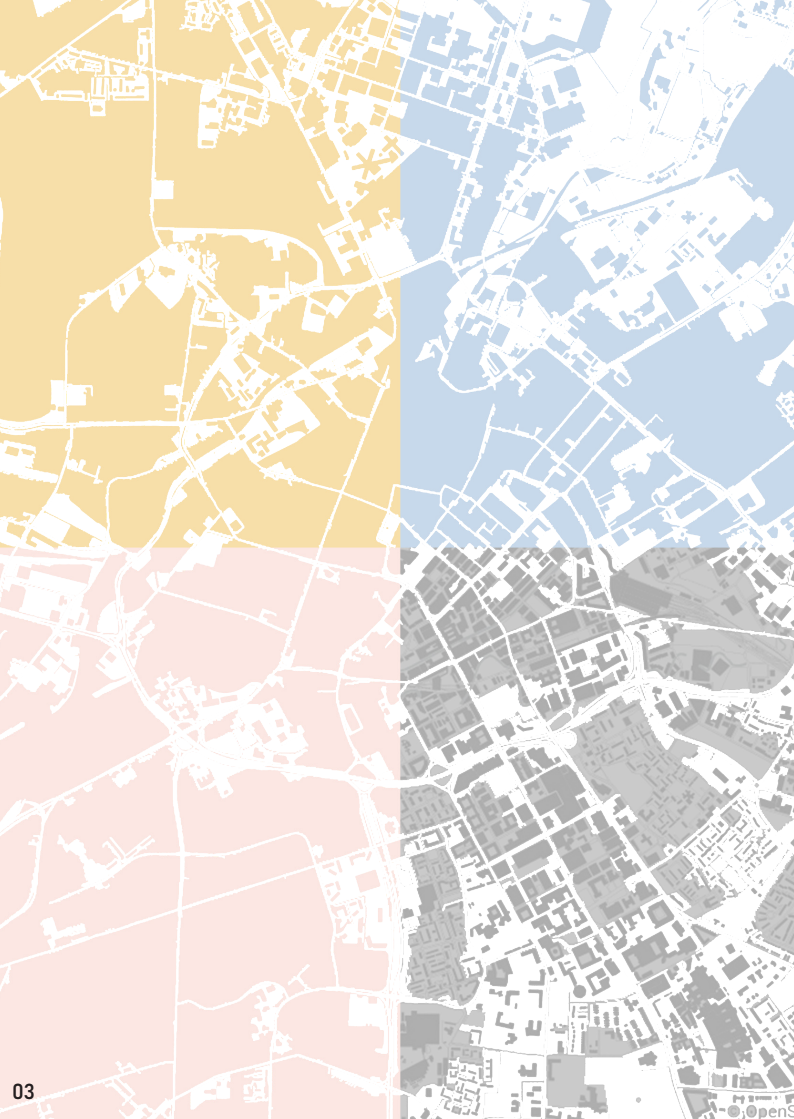

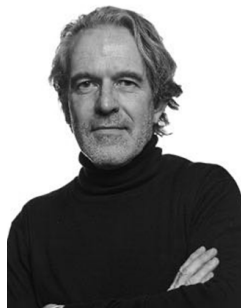
**EMILY

The topic of the presentation will be: The Proud Place: The co-design of Manchester's new LGBT+ Centre.



DOMINIC
SAGAR

Dominic Sagar was a founding partner in Sagar Stevenson Architects, who were instrumental in spearheading the regeneration of the area of Manchester, 'The Northern Quarter'. The practice has mainly included mixed-use projects, social housing, leisure, commercial, education, master planning, and feasibilities. His research focuses on post-industrial cities and how underground, communities, music and creative industries can act as a tool for regeneration. Other work includes engaging with urban and rural homelessness and food poverty issue; urban and rural projects researching the past, present and future of community architecture. The topic of the presentation will be: housing matters.



ANDY
AVERY

Andy graduated from Oxford School of Architecture in 1986 with honours in both architecture and in urban design. He has operated at board level within the profession since 1996 and leads Buttress' residential and regeneration team. He was joint author of the Urban Design Code for the redevelopment of Hulme in Manchester; a model document that has been developed for use throughout the City and adapted for use in many different forms across the UK. The topic of the presentation will be: Affordable Housing: Architectural Design and Masterplanning Approach.



EDDY
FOX

Eddy Fox was a late convert to landscape architecture. Whilst living and working in Barcelona, he looked on as the city was transformed in the build-up to the Olympics of 1992. The extraordinary energy and confidence of the city at that time expressed itself in the design of squares, parks, boulevards and incidental spaces, which dramatically changed the environment, quality of life. He studied at MMU in 1994 and subsequently working in a diverse range of local practices for more than a decade, before joining the MSA in 2010 as a Senior Lecturer. The topic of the presentation will be: Coexistence of humans and animals in cities.

O'NIDH

Macdara O'Nidh is an experienced landscape architect currently working as a principal consultant at LDA Design specialising in comprehensive urban planning, landscape design, and sustainability. LDA Design focuses on urbanist and environmental issues such as climate change and socioeconomic inequality. They seek to realise the potential of our landscapes to create sustainable spaces which allow communities to thrive. The presentation topic will be: Sustainable design for inclusive public spaces eliminating social inequalities. Macdara will present LDA-Design's Newcastle City Centre Transformation Programme.

Sally Stone is the Director of Continuity in Architecture Atelier at the Manchester School of Architecture. She has conducted extensive research on interior design and demonstrated practical reuse of buildings. She has published and co-authored several, including the Undoing Buildings and emerging practices in pedagogy. The topic of the presentation will be: Ensuring inclusivity through sustainable public spaces, designing sustainable public spaces may play a role in ensuring the *diversity* of communities and exploring ways of inclusivity through redesign of public spaces.

UDALL

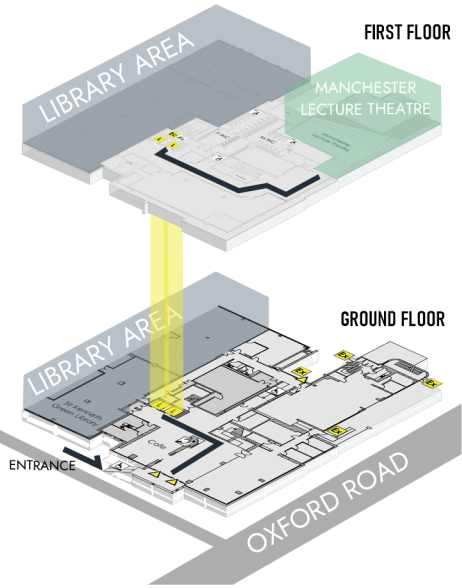

LEWIS

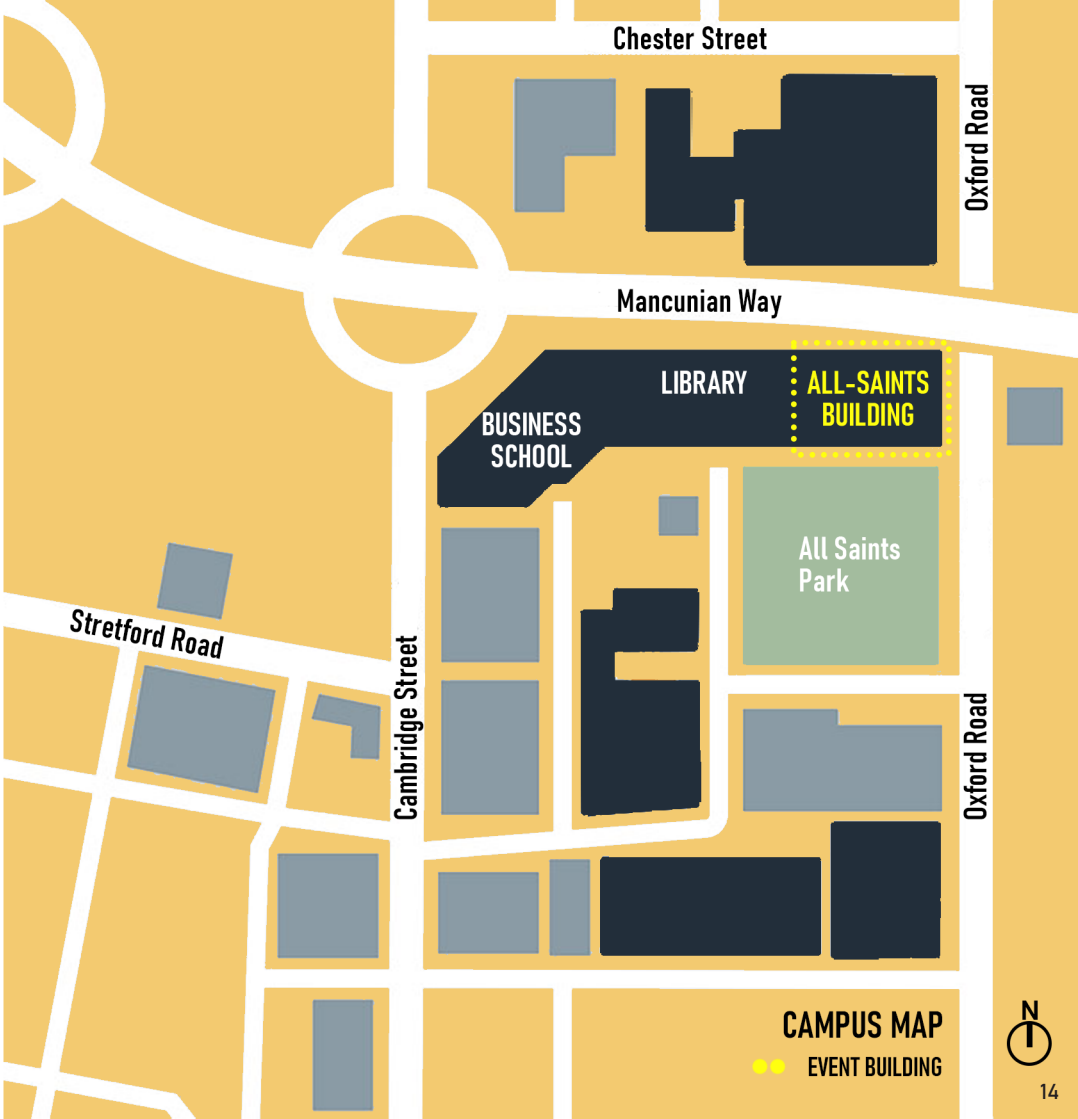
